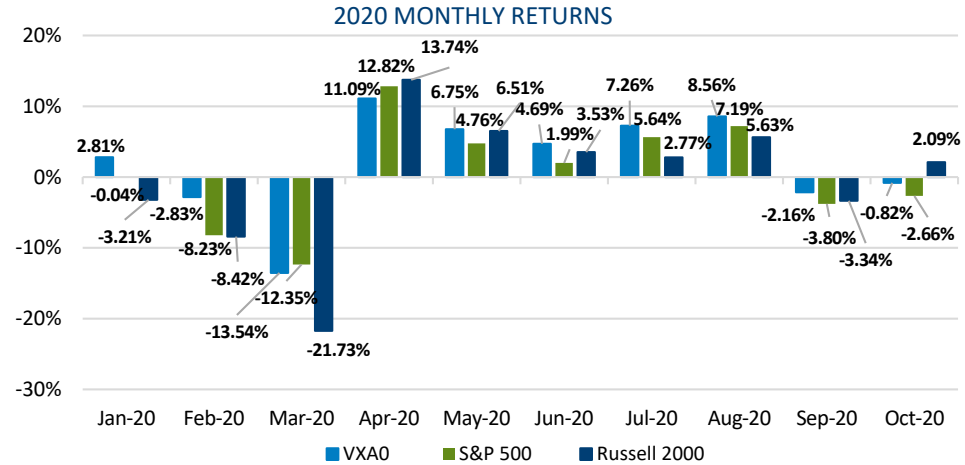

OVERVIEW

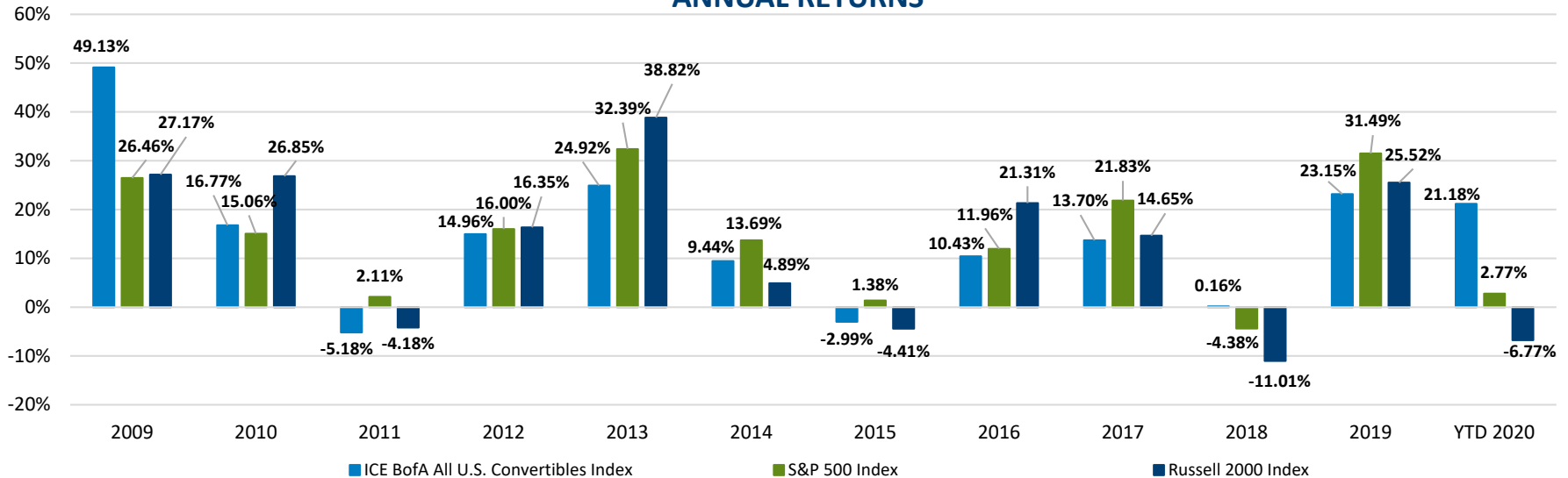
Much of the focus in the financial markets during October was on rotations and positioning around upcoming U.S. elections. As anticipated, monthly convertible new issuance returned to a more normal pace with \$4.6 billion globally and \$2 billion in the U.S. We continue to expect a healthy new issue calendar through year-end, which should push us over \$100 billion in the U.S. and possibly challenge historical highs. The secondary market saw outperformance from a few lagging sectors during the month. However, Technology and Consumer remain the driving force of convertible market returns this year. Markets continue to climb a wall of worry and we believe the asymmetric risk/reward profile of convertibles can be a valuable tool to help navigate volatility and capitalize on potential opportunities created by these uncertainties. The convertible market is expanding, we see very attractive supply/demand dynamics and we are excited about the benefits of an actively managed convertible strategy in these unique times.

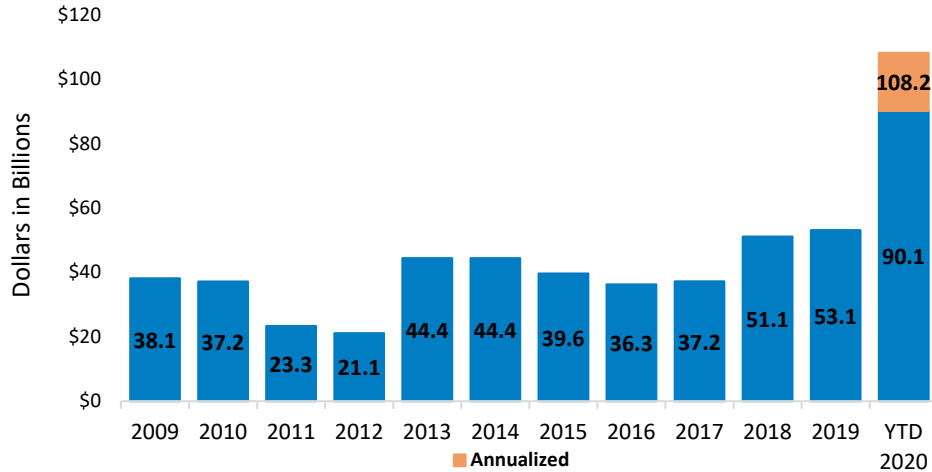
ANNUAL RETURNS



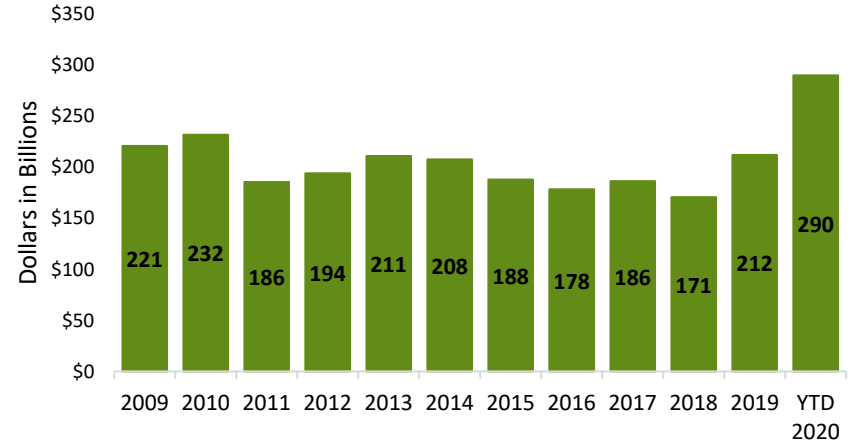

U.S. Convertible Market ISSUANCE



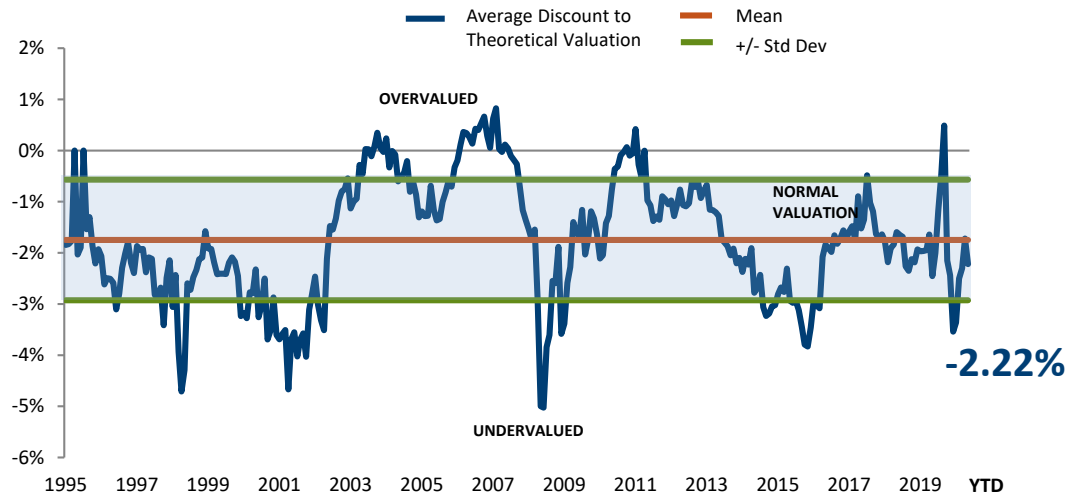

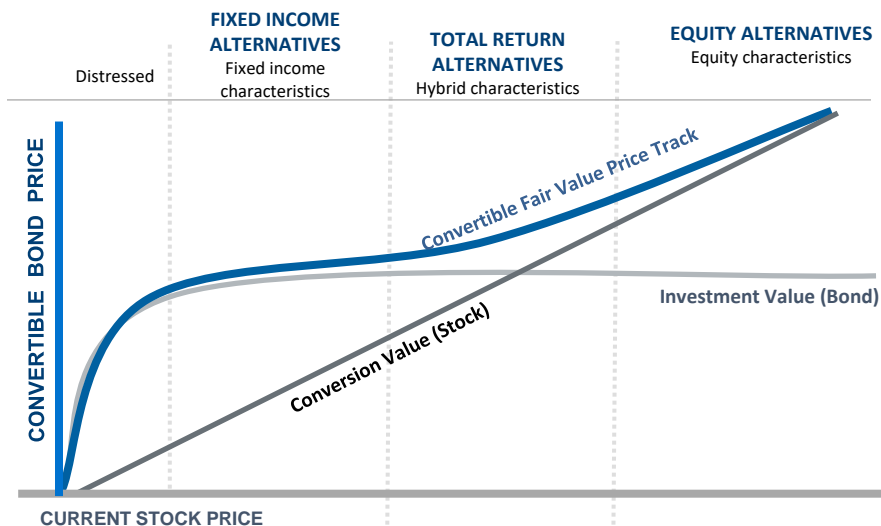
VALUATION OF THE CONVERTIBLE MARKET

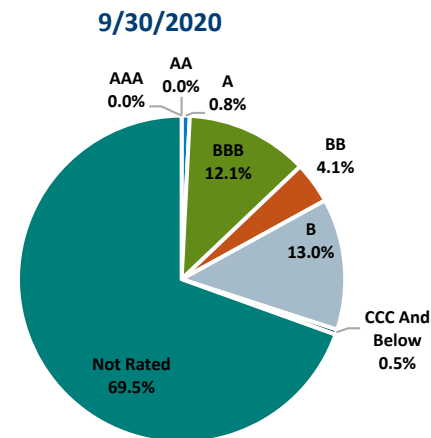
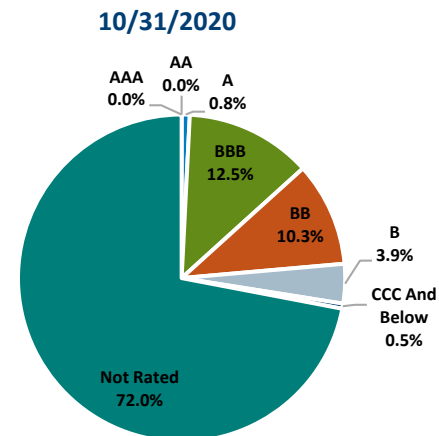
