Already, volatility in 2020 is ahead of pace, according to data in a post last week by Nasdaq Dorsey Wright. Through September 8, there have been a total of 80 +/-1% days in the S&P 500 versus an average of 65 days in a full trading year. And while the market on average experiences 16 +/- 2% days there have been 41 such days year to date (see chart below). Most of the volatility took place in the first half of the year with 38 +/- 1% days in Q2 and 31 in Q2. Q3 had been quiet until last week, even below average, and the post says September has the fewest extreme days (4.73 average) of any month. Definitions and Disclosures

The **Nontraditional Bond** category contains funds that pursue strategies divergent in one or more ways from conventional practice in the broader bond-fund universe. **Multialternative** funds offer investors exposure to several different alternative investment tactics.
