The Perils of Shorting a 'Dull' Market

WEEKLY HEADLINES

DataTrek Research last week quantified the perils of shorting a dull market: When the VIX "consistently trades below 20, the S&P 500 has done well and suffered no annual drawdowns," according to the note covered by MarketWatch.com (see chart bottom right).

But, the report acknowledged "legitimate questions

about whether the VIX has moved solidly into dull territory or is merely reflecting the 'calm before the storm." Historical data also shows that the stock market

rarely rallies more than 10% three years in a row. "A year-to-date gain of 12.5% leaves the market in 'somewhat rarefied' territory,'" DataTrek commented. The firm leaves room for the possibility of a Dull Market 5% pullback, even if it isn't a tradable short opportunity.

Definitions and Disclosures

The Nontraditional Bond category contains funds that pursue strategies divergent in one or more ways from conventional practice in the broader bond-fund universe.
